# About Lazio



Lazio is in central Italy, on the western coast. The region was formerly known to English travellers by its Roman name, Latium, although this version of the name is now rarely used. A major port of call on the Grand Tour, when eighteenth-century travellers explored its scenic villages, Lazio is now largely overlooked in favour of its capital, Rome.

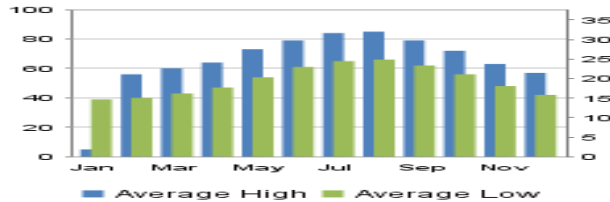


With so much tourism concentrated in Rome, it is a region waiting to be discovered: with a variety of extraordinary landscapes and environments, tracts of unspoiled countryside, long beaches and vast pine groves, mountains and lakes, hills and plains. Tourists are rare creatures in many of Lazio's smaller towns, and once locals realise that you are interested in their hometown they offer you a warm welcome.

# Castello di Santa Cristina

The Castello di Santa Cristina lies in a strategic position at the crossroads of Lazio and Tuscany, one and a half hours from Rome. It is a ten minute drive north of Lake Bolsena and only 3km away from Grotte di Castro, a fascinating ancient village of Etruscan origin set deep in the Tuscan Hills. The breathtakingly splendid 17th century castle, (complete with fairytale turret) has been the property of the noble Caterini family for generations.



## Castello di Santa Cristina



The castle's 18th Century ivy-covered farmhouse and out-buildings have been carefully restored and turned into guest rooms. All guest rooms are furnished with original pieces and infused with the traditional rural style of the Italian countryside.

The ground floor of the farmhouse opens onto the main terrace, which overlooks the swimming pool. There is a large "taverna" with brick vaulted ceiling where regional dishes are served each evening. Breakfast is served up at the Castle (note that there are steps to get to/from breakfast!)

# Painting Locations

In addition to painting at the Castello we will also go on trips to the medieval village of Sovana, Marta on lake Bolsena, Fra Viaco, a stunning Tuscan vineyard and Civita di Bagnoregio, an almost deserted town.

**Sovana**, formerly called Suvana by the Etruscan ("the Tuscan city"), has been elected one of the most beautiful medieval towns of Italy – you will understand it once you get there. Rich flowers and plants make a charming contrast with the old lime stone walls.



**Marta**, (Lake Bolsena) with its crystal clear waters is ringed by gently sloping hills with crescents of fine volcanic sandy beaches. Fishermen gather their boats in the little harbour at Marta, where they land their catch of pike, perch

and many other local fish.

**Fra Viaco**, a family run agriturismo overlooking Lake Mezzano is situated in the heart of Tuscia on the Tuscan border. The small crater lake of volcanic origin was formed 400,000 years ago.



**Civita di Bagnoregio**, an idyllic spot known as il paese che muore (in Italian: "the dying town") with only 8 inhabitants it resembles an enchanted town. In its silent narrow streets one marvels at the existence of a place where time stopped several hundreds of years ago.



**Warning:** please note that Civita di Bagnoregio is only accessible via a 900-foot-long bridge.
